Title of second slide¹

This page shows nested, “vertically compressed” lists using the `citemize` and `cenumerate` environments of `elpres`:

- first line in an itemized list
- second line in an itemized list
 1. first line of numbered list
 2. second line of numbered list
- final line in itemized list

For footnotes using \LaTeX 's `\footnote{}` command, the `footmisc` package, providing the option `perpage`² is recommended.³

¹ footnotes often are not a good idea for a presentation, better avoid them!

² this forces \LaTeX to start footnote numbers with “1” on each slide

³ another option is `symbol*` which allows to mark footnotes with symbols instead of numbers

Title of fourth slide

environment name: `cdescription`, comparable to \LaTeX 's
`description` environment

used for: vertically compressed lists with small “titles” of items

Title of fifth slide

If justified text and hyphenation is to be suppressed, the `ragged2e` package may be used with the `document` and `originalparameters` options.

In order to avoid an option clash, `ragged2e` should follow `footmisc` in the preamble, if both packages are used.
