1 Introduction

This package provides a means to use some PostScript fonts with L^AT_EX. The fonts are similar to some fonts used in the context of the startrek films.

The PostScript fonts are not contained in the distribution but have to be a got separately.

This package has been created for an article in ”Die T_EXnische Komödie” [1]. This article contains some more details on the package and its use.

2 Usage

<code>\TNG</code>	The command <code>\TNG</code> changes the current font family to <code>StarTrekTNGCrilleA</code> and the encoding to <code>T1</code> . Usually this should be used in a T _E X group only.
<code>\textTNG</code>	The command <code>\textTNG</code> typesets its argument with the <code>StarTrekTNGCrilleA</code> font.
<code>\STClassic</code>	The command <code>\STClassic</code> changes the current font family to <code>StarTrekClassicA</code> and the encoding to <code>T1</code> . Usually this should be used in a T _E X group only.
<code>\textSTClassic</code>	The command <code>\textSTClassic</code> typesets its argument with the <code>StarTrekClassicA</code> font.
<code>\STMovie</code>	The command <code>\STMovie</code> changes the current font family to <code>StarTrekClassicA</code> and the encoding to <code>T1</code> . Usually this should be used in a T _E X group only.
<code>\textSTMovie</code>	The command <code>\textSTMovie</code> typesets its argument with the <code>StarTrekClassicA</code> font.
<code>\TNGtitle</code>	The command <code>\TNGtitle</code> changes the current font family to <code>StarTrekTNGTi-</code>

`\DeclareTextFontCommand\textSTClassic{\fontfamily{fsc}\selectfont}`

`\STMovie` The macro `\STMovie` selects the StarTrekClassicMoviesA family.
`\DeclareRobustCommand\STMovie{\fontfamily{fsm}\selectfont}`

`\textSTMovie` The macro `\textSTMovie` typesets its arguments in the StarTrekClassicMoviesA font.
`\DeclareTextFontCommand\textSTMovie{\fontfamily{fsm}\selectfont}`

`\TNGtitle` The macro `\TNGtitle` selects the StarTrekTNGTitleA family.
`\DeclareRobustCommand\TNGtitle{\fontfamily{ftt}\selectfont}`

`\textTNGtitle` The macro `\textTNGtitle` typesets its arguments in the StarTrekTNGTitleA font.
